**AIMS OF THE COURSE**

Study, clarification, assimilation of grammatic and syntactic structures of different complexity and of the related phraseology. Consolidation and expansion of the vocabulary. Development and consolidation of students' oral skills.

**CLASS FORMAT**

Study of linguistic structures with drills, exercises, oral practice. Study and application of idiomatic verbs and expressions through written and oral practice. Use and linguistic analysis of original sources: literature, essays, newspapers, movies. Written and oral exercises and practice for the consolidation of the vocabulary. Elaboration of essays and oral presentations and reports on assigned subjects and on subjects chosen by the students. Practice in speaking.

**CLASS SCHEDULE**

The following schedule is tentative and may be changed at the discretion of the instructor to reflect the class's rate of progress.

8 th week	Subjunctive: present tense - past tense
9th week	Subjunctive: the four tenses
10th week	Subjunctive and conditional: the conditional sentence Test
11th week	Hypothetical sentence
12th week	Review - Indirect speech with past tense verbs
13th week	Final Test – date and time to be announced

**GRADING**

**MEMORANDUM**

Attendance to these courses is mandatory and more than two unexcused absences will lower the grade (excused absences will be accepted for serious medical reasons or serious emergencies).

More than **five unexcused absences** will result in failure of the course.

In order not to disrupt the class, punctuality is required. Students are expected to be in class at the beginning of the class hour; any delay exceeding ten minutes will be considered an absence.

During the academic year photocopies and other material will be distributed in class by the instructors. Students who have not been in class are responsible for getting the material from their classmates and making their own photocopies. All assigned homework should be completed prior to entering the class. Use of the computer in class is restricted to oral presentations.

The language spoken in class is Italian.

No other activities such as eating, etc. are allowed.

Dates of exams can not be changed for individual needs. Students should take note of the dates and hours of the midterm and final exams and plan their trips after the last exam. It is important to tell friends and relatives about this so they do not surprise you by buying tickets for you for trips to be made before that date. Missing the midterm or the final exam will mean failure of the course.

The completion during the PLP of one of the Italian Language courses ITL101 I, ITL102 I, ITL201 I or 301 I is prerequisite for admission to Italian classes in the Fall Semester. The completion of two of the Fall Semester Italian courses is prerequisite for admission to Italian classes in the Spring Semester. Incompletes will be allowed only for serious emergencies and must be completed within two weeks.
